On the right is **Deanna Lynn Peacock**, 63-year-old grandmother and mom of three adult sons, is a double lung transplant recipient. Diagnosed in 2007 with Idiopathic Pulmonary Fibrosis, she was given two to five years to live unless she had a lifesaving lung transplant. Deanna was one of the lucky ones to “get on the list and be gifted” with double lungs in 2012.

On the left is **Margot Crowder Davidson**. She and her husband are close friends and main supporters for Deanna throughout her transplant journey. Over the past 10 years Margot has become a passionate advocate for organ donation awareness along with her friend Deanna.

This year marks the tenth 'lungaversary' of Deanna's double lung transplant!!!

Their presentation will unveil Deanna's miracle story through dialogue and PowerPoint slides, sharing the challenges and gifts of her diagnosis, transplant, recovery as well as the ongoing assessments, treatments, and medications.

Their focus is on the importance of looking at different ways of managing the pending reality of death through gratitude, faith and supports. The concept of 'new normal' after transplant will be discussed as an ongoing emotional, mental and physical challenge, particularly with decreased lung function, rejection and the possibility of a second double lung transplant.

This heartfelt dialogue between two friends, includes tears of gratitude, pain, love and fear and will demonstrate the importance of personal and community support. They will also share their passion about the importance of organ donation, the relationship with the donor and donor family, and how that can impact someone else and give the gift of a second chance at life.
